Discussion

We all have a place called home. Discuss among your group where that home is. What makes it home? What are some fond memories you have of your home? Do you often long for home and why?

Dig into the Word

Read the following passages:

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- Philippians 3:20
- Hebrews 11:13-16

Q: Where would these passages say “home” for the Christian is?

Q: What does it mean to be an ambassador? How does this relate to the idea of home?

Q: In Hebrews 11, those written about had a very tangible faith. For what were these people longing?

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Q: What is the difficulty of longing and living for something beyond the here and now? What are we prone to do?

Q: How does my girl's saving for their Disney vacation compare and contrast with our home in heaven?

Invest in a Home

We live in a country that by all standards is wealthy. Read the following passages that talk about wealth.

- Ecclesiastes 5:10-15

- 1 Timothy 6:17-19
- Matthew 6:20-21

Q: What do these passages say about living in the “here and now” versus eternity: our home.

Q: A lot of wealthy individuals, superstars, athletes, and musicians invest their wealth in their community. Why do you think they would do this? How does this connect to the idea of home?

Q: How should Christians invest, who are of a home beyond? What might this look like? Be creative? What are the struggles? (refer back to my Disney vacation.)

Application

Q: What are one or two things you could do to invest in your “home?”

Q: What are some things you might do to keep your head and heart focused on home: heaven and eternity?

Q: What are your struggles with keeping your focus on this home? Share these with the group. Pray for one another.

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
